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4. First-Aid Measures

Description of first aid measures

General advice:

5. Fire-Fighting Measures

Extinguishing media

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6. Accidental release measures

Personal precautions, protective equipment and emergency procedures

Environmental precautions

Do not discharge into the subsoil/soil. Do not discharge into drains/surface waters/groundwater. Contain contaminated water/firefighting water. Methods and material for containment and cleaning up

Dike spillage. Pick up with suitable absorbent material. Place into suitable containers for reuse or disposal in a licensed facility. 7. Handling and Storage

Precautions for safe handling
